## **Key vocab** Definition

Victorian	Anything Victorian happened during the reign of Queen Victoria.			
seaside resort	A town next to the sea, where people go on holiday or for day trips, is a seaside resort.			
promenade	This is a long, wide footpath next to the beach.			
souvenir	This is something you might buy and take home to remind you of the seaside.			
bathing machine	A bathing machine was somewhere to get changed into swimwear without being seen.			
penny lick	Denny lick A penny lick was a small glass used for serv ice-cream.
