What should I know?

I should be able to recognise the difference between past and present in my own and other people's lives.

Facts I will learn

I will learn that many changes happened between the stone age and the iron age. I will learn that there is no written evidence from this time so we have to rely on archaelogical finds.

I will learn that at first the people were hunter-gatherers but then settled in farming villages and eventually hillforts were built.

I will learn thatt Stonehenge was built during this period but exactly why is still a mystery.

I will learn that the use of metals changed the way people hunted, traded and made objects for decoration.

I will learn that people moved from living in family groups to living in tribes.

Key questions

What were the main changes in Britain from the Stone Age to the Iron Age?

- How did the way people live change during this period?
- Where does this period fit on a history timeline?
- How do we know what happened in the stone, bronze and iron ages?
- Looking at the evidence, why do you think Stonehenge was built?
- What was the reason for building hill forts?
- Why was the discovery of metal so important?
