

<div>What should I know?</div> <div><ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>How to use a simple app on the computer or device</li><li>That information can be retrieved from computers</li><li>That a range of technology is used in homes and schools</li><li>To know that behaviours online can upset others and what these behaviours are.</li><li>To know what to do if I see something online I do not like.</li><li>To ask permission to use technology and that I may need help from an adult while doing this.</li></ul></div> <div></div>		<div>Facts I will learn ...</div> <div><ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>That technology can give rapid access to a wide variety of information and resources, including internet, TV, DVDs</li><li>That a website has a unique address and the need for precision when typing it</li><li>That a screen can be minimised or a monitor turned off if anything inappropriate appears on the screen before telling a trusted adult</li><li>That I may not like all the things I see online.</li><li>That I can search for information online</li></ul></div> <div></div>		<div>Key questions ...</div> <div><ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>How do I hide anything unsettling I see whilst I report it to an adult?</li><li>How can I find information on the internet?</li><li>What is a search engine?</li><li>What is a key word search?</li><li>How can I store my work on the computer to come back to later?</li></ul></div> <div></div>

<b>Website</b>	A location on the World Wide Web. A website contains a home page and other pages that are linked to the home page.
<b>Address Bar</b>	An <b>address bar</b> is a text <b>field</b> near the top of a Web browser window that displays the <b>URL</b> of the current webpage.
<b>Permission</b>	Being allowed to do something after asking a trusted adult
<b>Device</b>	A technological piece of equipment.
<b>Behaviour</b>	The way someone acts or conducts themselves
<b>Trusted</b>	A person who is reliable and truthful
<b>Encounter</b>	To have contact with a person or thing
