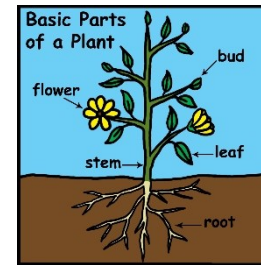

- That patterns can be found when studying living things

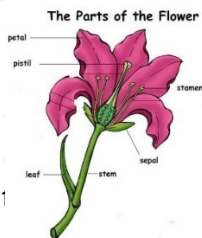
Facts I will learn ...

A living thing that uses the sunlight to create food..
