#### What should I know?

- That IT can automate manual processes e.g. find and replace and understand the advantages and disadvantages of this
- That images, 3D representations, sounds and text can be subject to copyright and abide by copyright rules when creating a presentation
- That web users have to observe the terms and conditions of websites
- That some electronic communication can be malicious or inappropriate
- The process of finding specific information, noting any difficulties during the process and how these were overcome
- That information found as a result of a search can vary in relevance.
- How to distinguish between fact and opinion by cross checking sources
- To recognise that anyone can be an author on the internet and sometimes web content is inaccurate or even offensive

### Facts I will learn ...

- How we can effectively manage and store passwords
- Explain what to do if a password gets lost, stolen or shared.
- Why we should keep apps up to date
- How to increase privacy on apps and services which provide privacy settings
- That online content can target people to gain money or information illegally.
