Feminine nouns

una manzana –an apple

una zanahoria - a carrot

una pera - a pear

una sandía – a watermelon

Masculine nouns:

un plátano - a banana

un melocotón - a peach

un tomate- a tomato

un melón – a melon

un pepino – a cucumber

Grammar

We add “s” or “es” at the end of the word in Spanish to make the noun a plural word e.g. **un plátano → dos plátanos; un melón → tres melones**
