Fact Bank

Spain is that the country has more than **5000 kilometers (over 3100 miles)** of **coastline**, and it borders both the **Atlantic Ocean** and the **Mediterranean Sea**. Grammar

The phrase “**puedes**” translates to “**you can**” in English. When using “**puedes**”, it must be followed by a verb in its infinitive form. For example: **puedes tener** (you can have), **puedes hacer** (you can do), **puedes comer** (you can eat) etc.
