Why is “brown hair” in Spanish not “pelo marrón”?

The word “**castaño**” derives from “**castaña**”, which means chesnut. So in Spanish, we refer to brown hair as “chesnut (colour) hair”.

Grammar Bank

There are two words for ‘**the**’ in Spanish : el and la.

There are two words for ‘**a**’ in Spanish: un and una.

With **plural** nouns they become : los/las and unos/unas.

When you ask a question in Spanish, raise the pitch of your voice at end of the question, this is called **intonation**.
