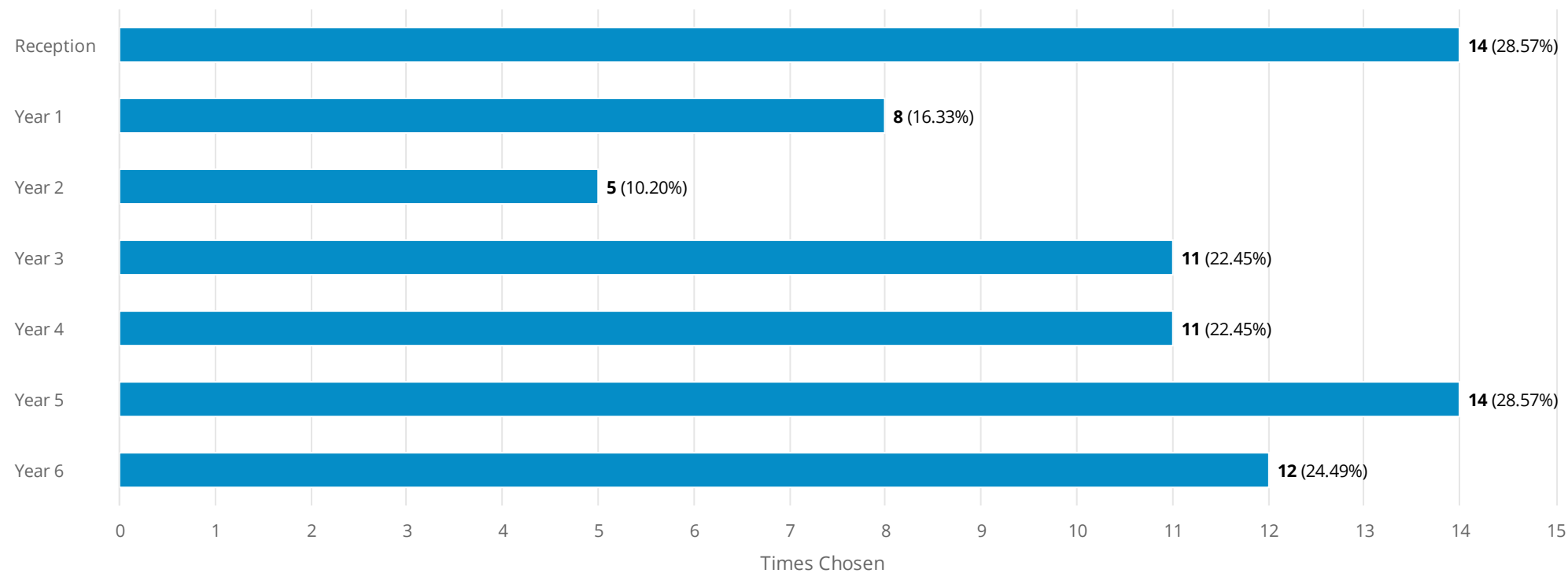

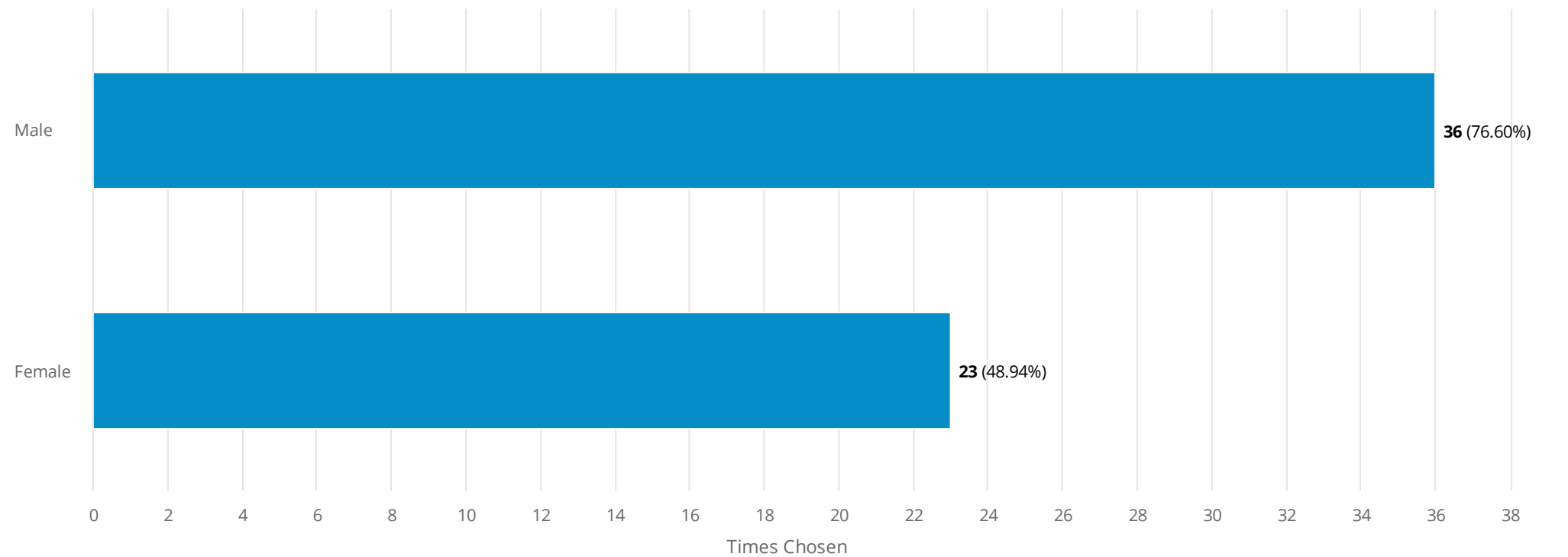
1. Which year is your child in?

Number of responses: 49



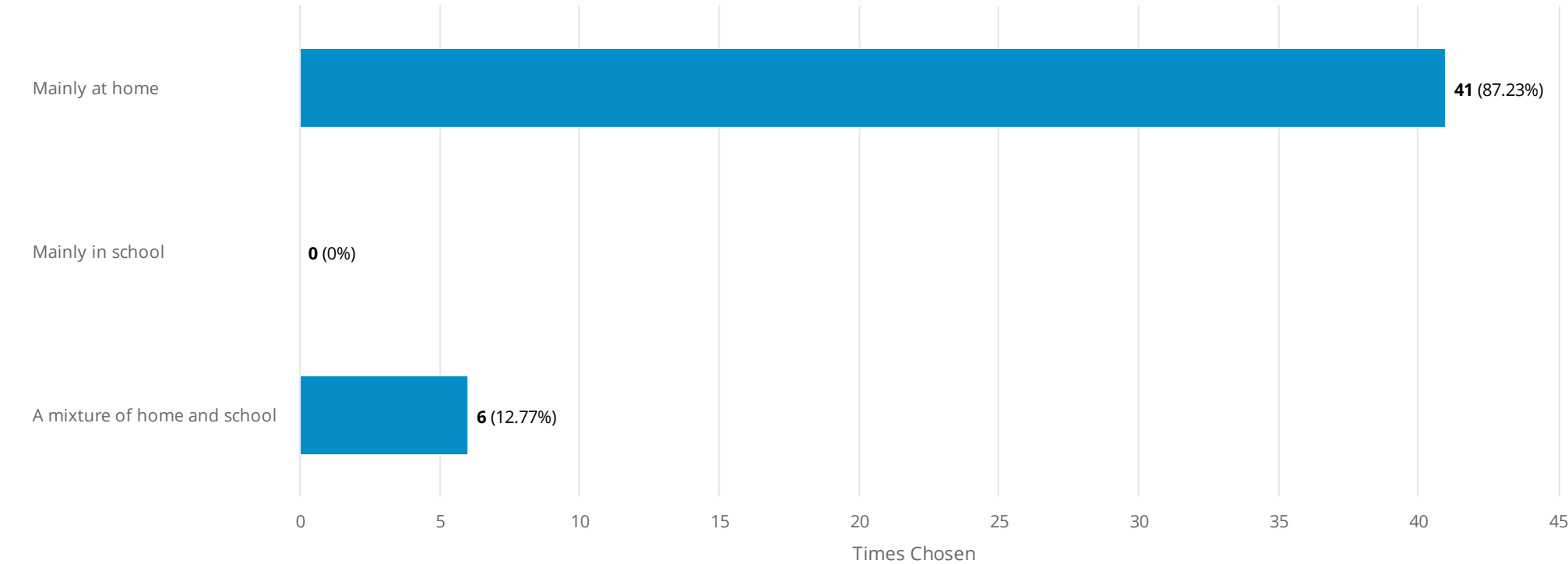
2. Is your child male or female ?

Number of responses: 47



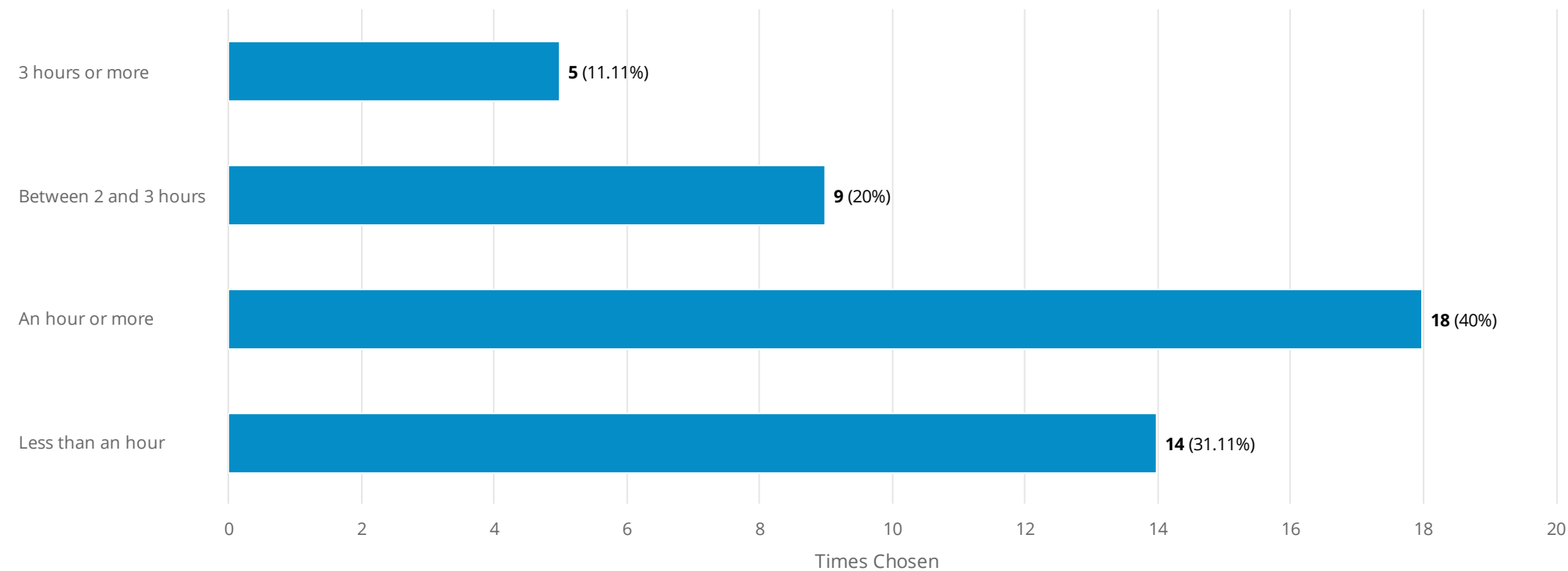
3. During lockdown was your child?

Number of responses: 47



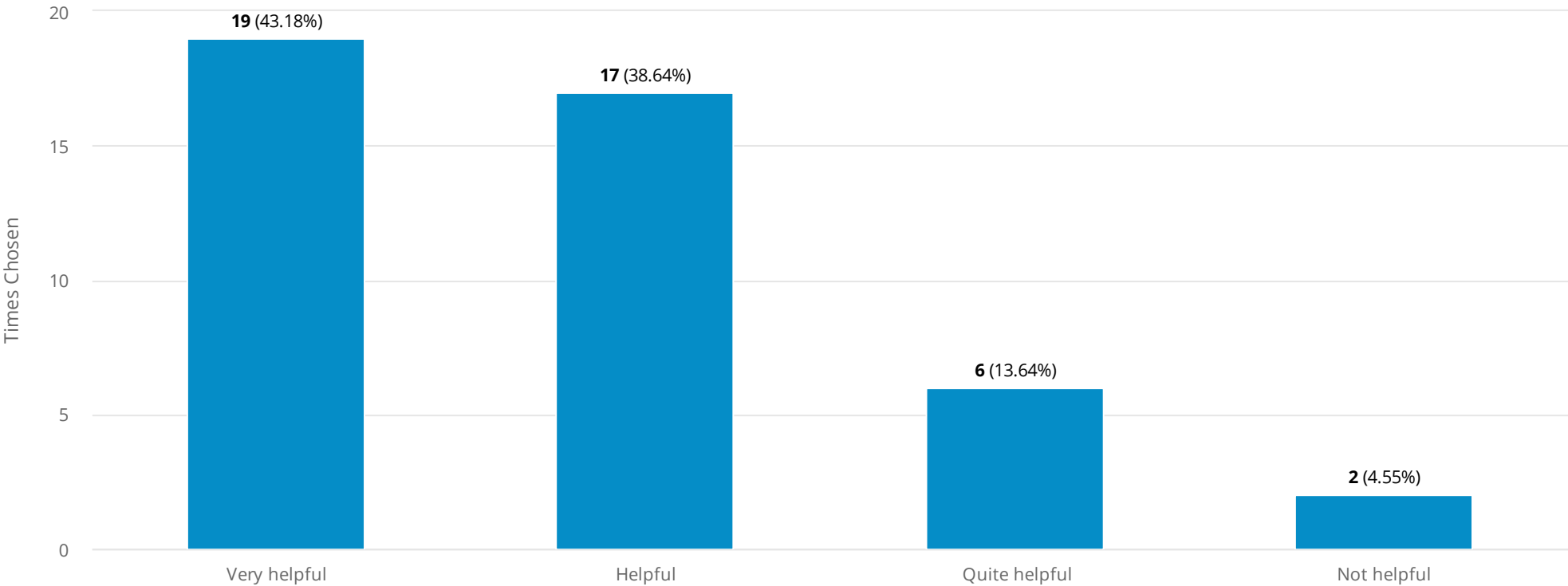
4.During lockdown on average, how much home learning was your child able to do every day?

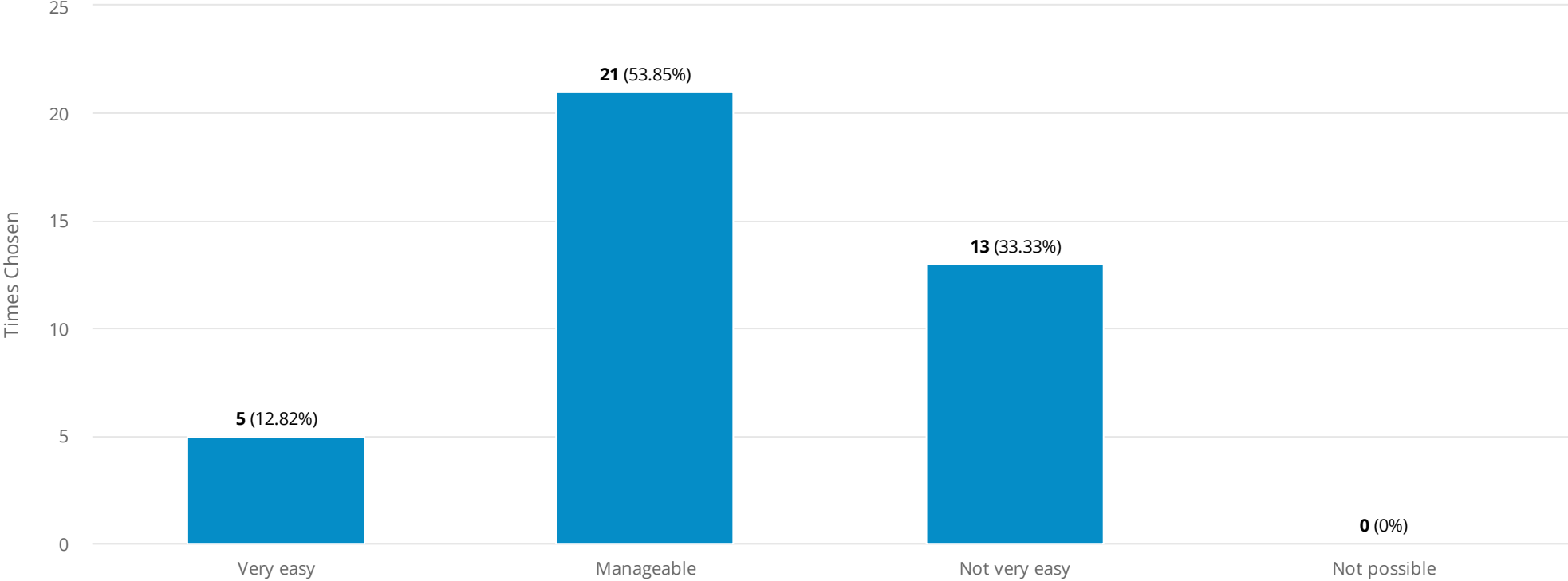

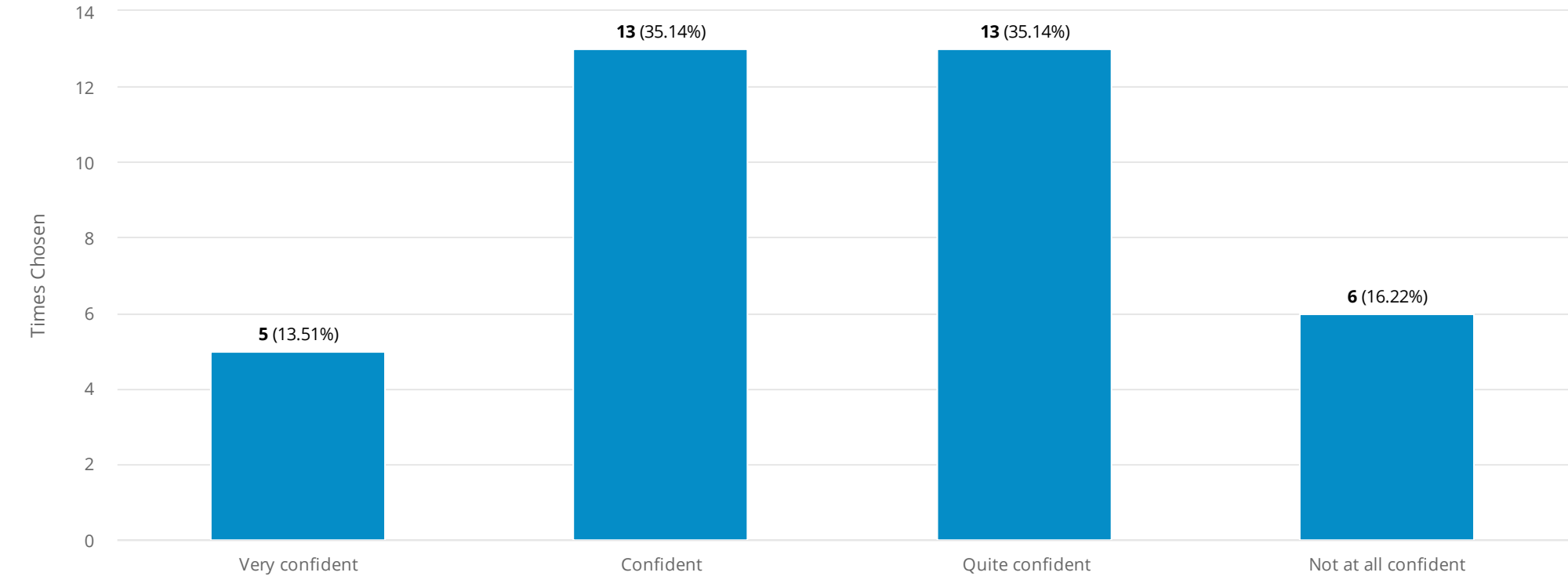
7. How easy is it for you to provide a suitable working environment for your child for home learning?

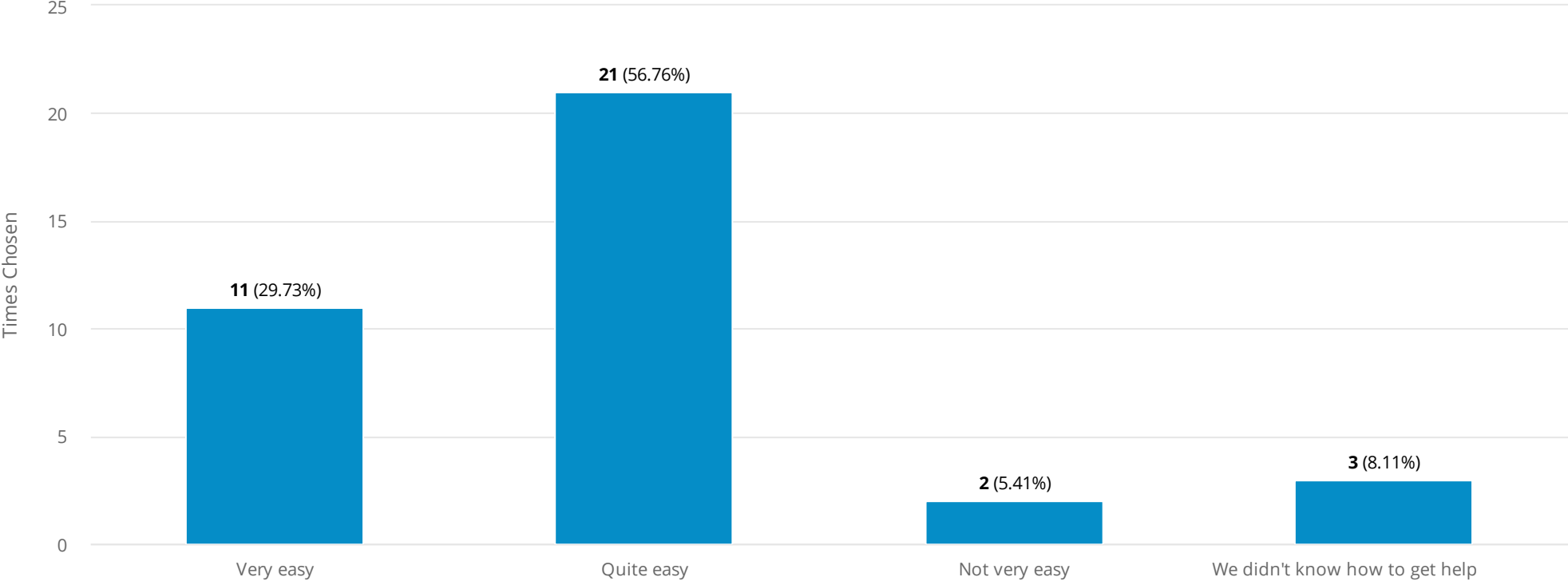
8. To what extent do you (and other family members) feel able to help your child when they are stuck or don't understand their work?

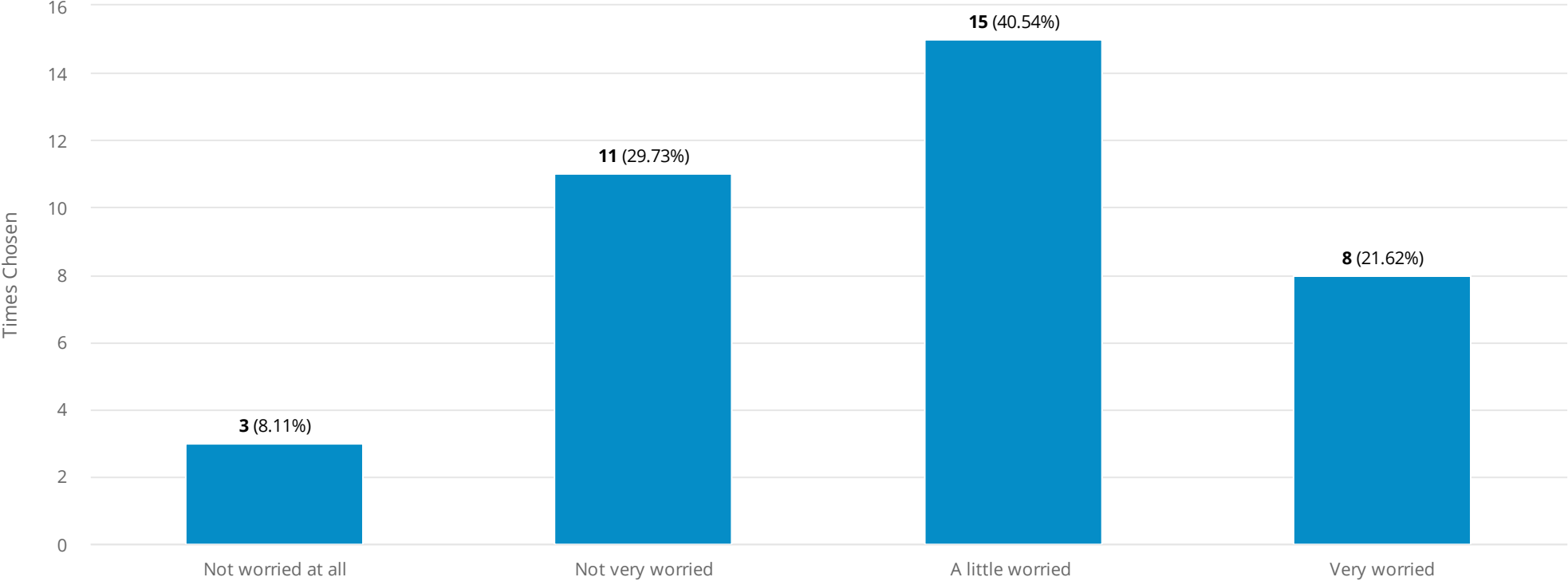
9. How easy was it for you/or your child to get help from school if you had a problem with home learning?

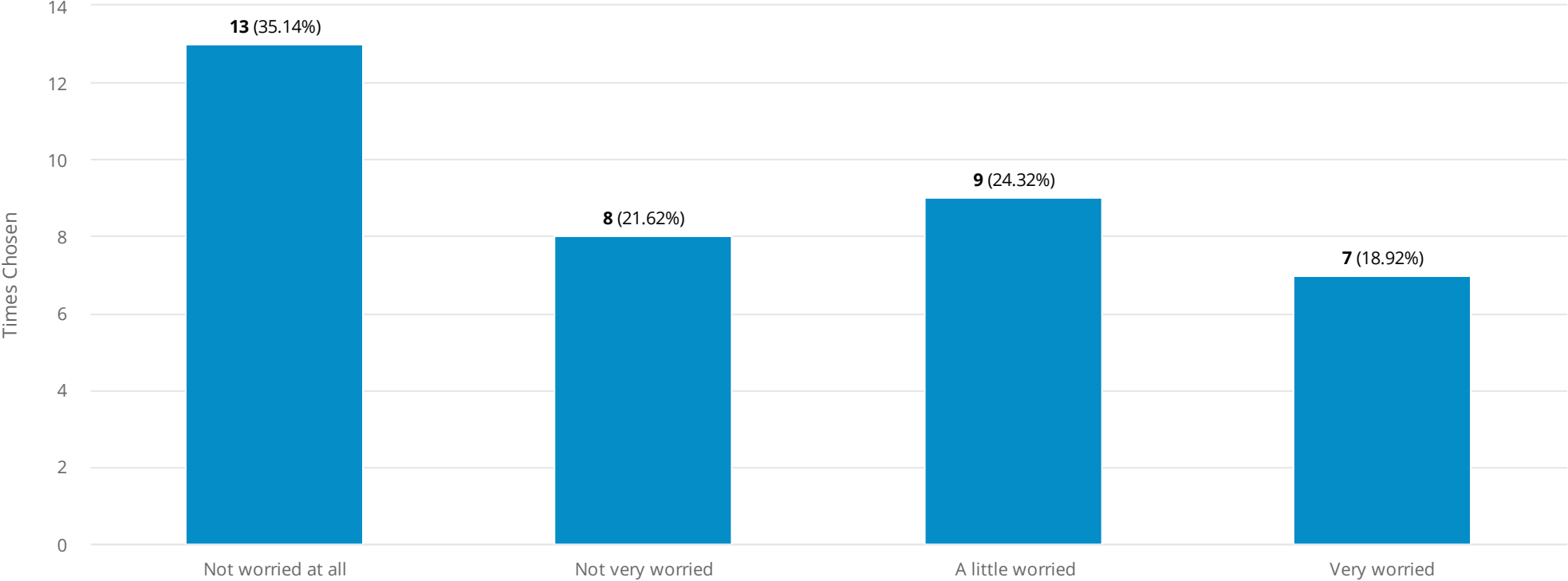
10. Are you worried about your child falling behind with their learning?

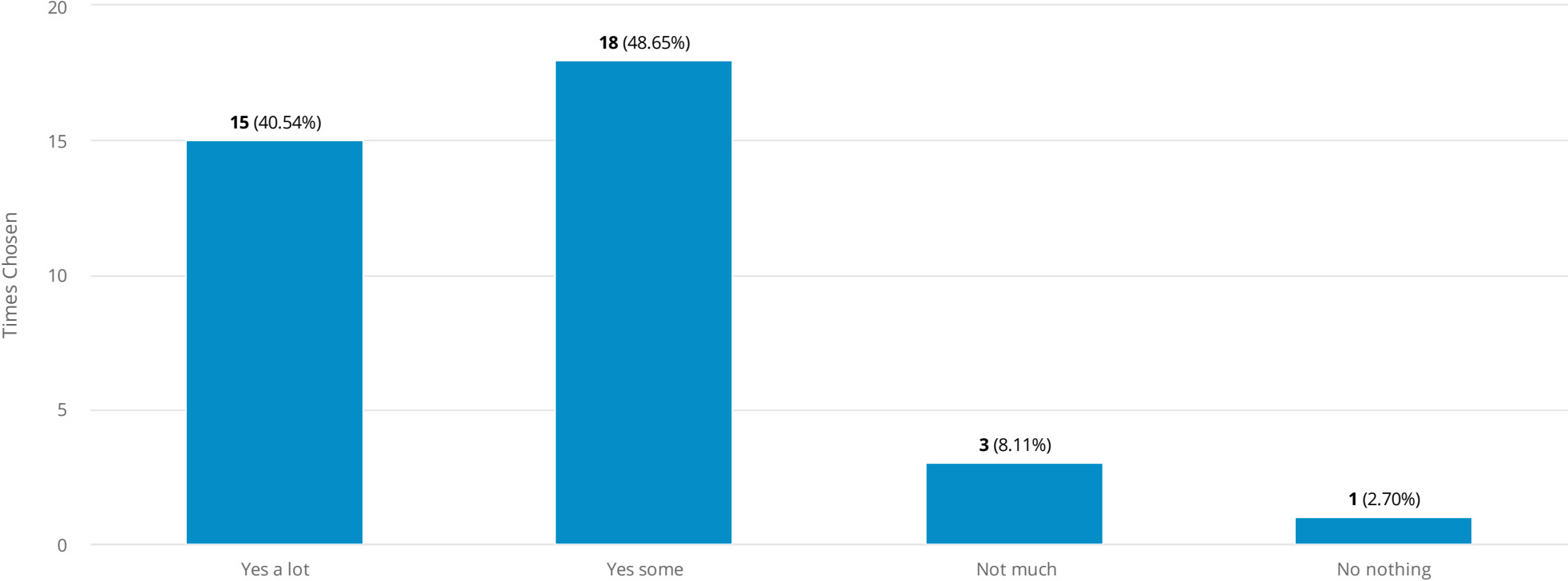
11. Are you worried about your child's wellbeing being affected by lockdown?

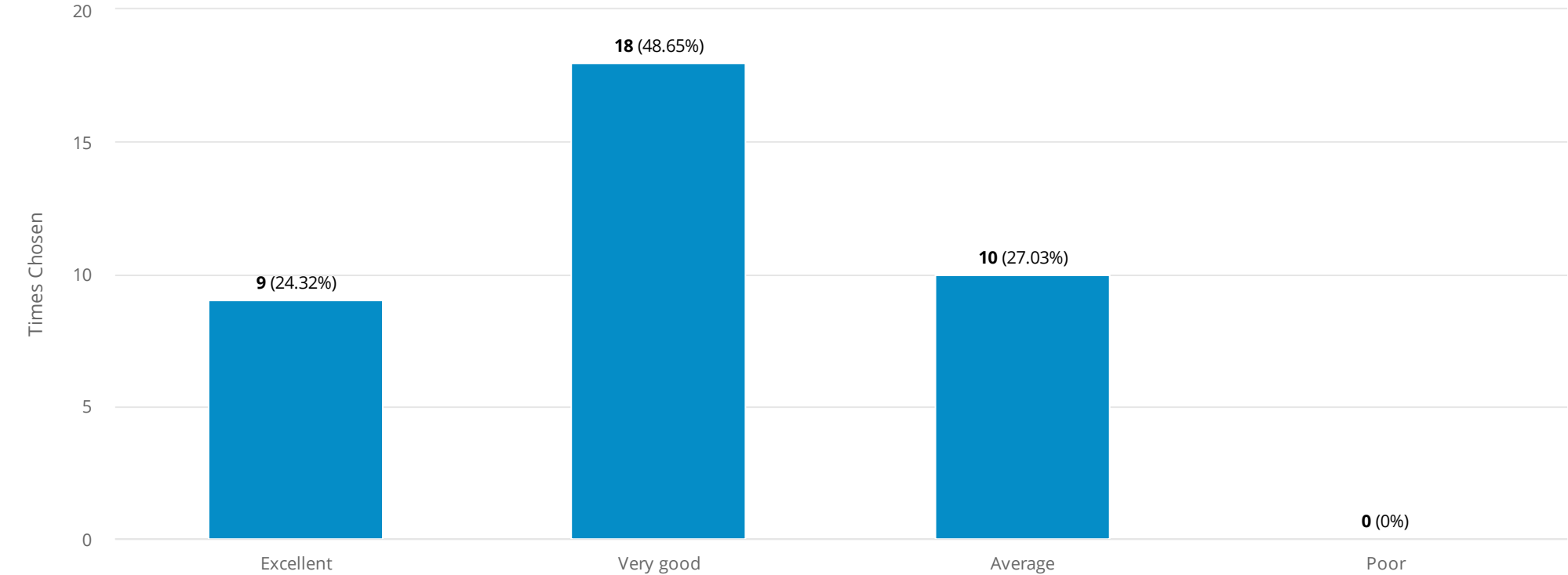
12. During lockdown did the school offer ideas and advice to keep your child fit and healthy at home?

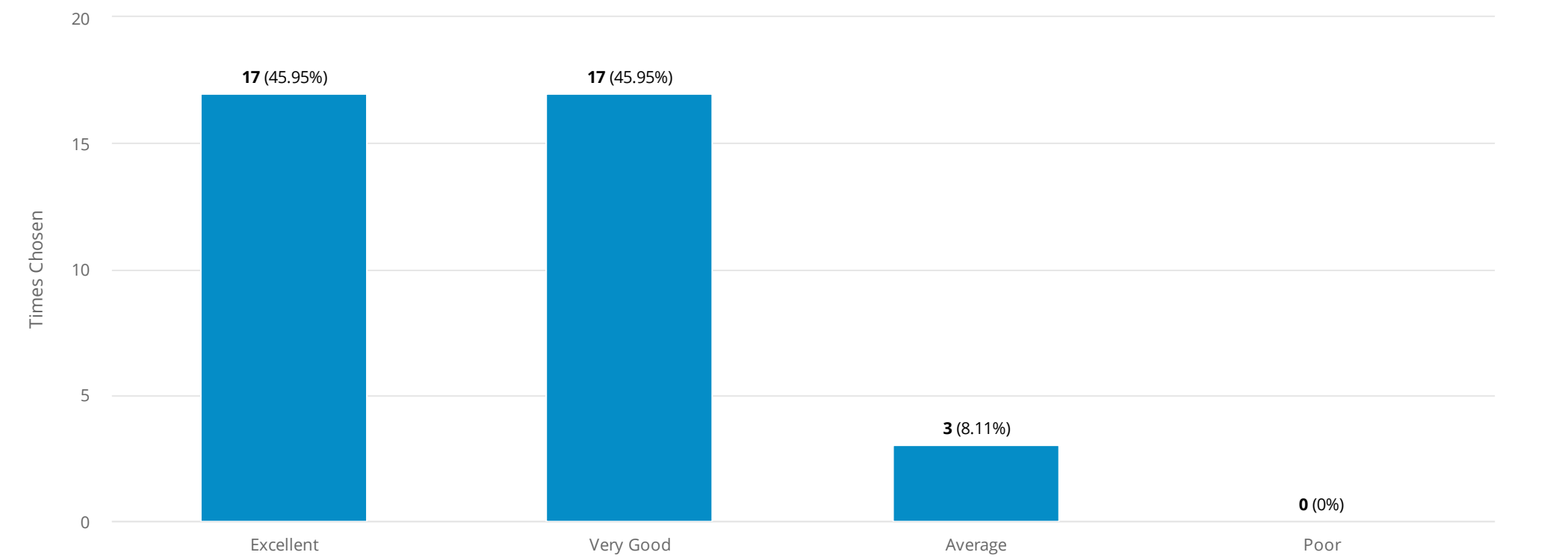
13. On reflection, do you think the school's response to switching to home learning during lockdown was:
